Presumably, book writing is too high-falutin', theoretical, or academic to appeal to an operating editor. I feel, therefore, that I did well in wearing down that resistance over a period of six years and at last extracting from him this book. As a matter of fact, the book is based on deeds, not proposals. It is essentially a newspaperman's report - and a statesman's - on a project in community stabilization and enrichment in which Mr. Tate, the Bloomington (Illinois) Daily Pantagraph, of which he is editor, Alvin Anderson of the University of Illinois, and others took the lead. Can a big-brother community - in this case Bloomington - live in constructive harmony with little-brother communities? Can it add strength and service to their existence and receive strength and support from them in turn without undermining their economy and culture and destroying their identity as small communities? The survival of these small communities alongside of the larger one is central in Mr. Tate's vision. The importance of their continuity, influence, and way of life is the gist of his message. He rejects the urban patterns of anonymous, mass culture that tend to dominate modern times. This is a radical idea in the best sense; it is deep rooted. In the outstanding success of his community cooperation project it is quietly revolutionary. How should this trade-off between international and domestic inequalities be resolved? At the same time, the reduction of biocultural diversity caused by globalization needs to be avoided. What kind of change is required in local communities to conserve biocultural diversity? On the issue of commodity flow, research results of the supply-chain network, isolation in industry, and resource flows and stocks are presented in this book. For monetary flow, ownership networks, value-added networks, and profit shifting were studied; and regarding the flow of people, linkage of ethnic groups, immigrant assimilation, and refugees were examined. Based on the resulting view of globalization and isolation, the development of the isolation index using machine learning is discussed. Finally, recommendations for evidence-based policymaking in the United Nations are considered. The concept of community development is often misunderstood, holding different meanings across different academic disciplines. Too frequently community ecology takes a much narrower focus. This may partly be the result of perceived antagonisms between schools of thought in ecology. Despite their rather separate origins, the multiple theoretical and methodological tools that now exist must be applied synthetically to real communities if the progress of the past two decades is to continue into the next two. This book has a case history format, which increases the opportunity for detailed analysis, although I have attempted to maintain the general perspective of a community ecologist and to draw extensively from the literature whenever it seems profitable to do so. The case history data are for Lake Lanao, a large tropical lake. The main zooplankton data base used in the analysis is entirely original and unpublished, although the detailed supporting data on the physical-chemical environment and the phytoplankton community have been presented in numerous journal articles and are thus abstracted or used selectively to meet the needs of zooplankton community analysis.
