Too many, in fact, for the pages of this book. As we trace these ideas and we learn from them, keep in mind the context of the covenant. By this, I mean one thing that is highly important. In the Old Testament the ideas are similar, but at the same time very different from the ideas in the New Testament. They are not contradictory, just different. In the Old Testament we really see a lot more in terms of outward renewal such as "strength" and "vision" and physical things of life. This is what they needed. Internal spiritual renewal was absolutely present however it is not a main tenant of this former covenant. All of it was prior to the birth of Christ, therefore their hope was in something that they had never seen and most of them never would see. Believers in God in the Old Testament needed, more than anything, to be renewed in those things. New Testament believers on the other hand had seen Jesus. His birth was in their history, rather than in their future. For them renewal was more about internal, spiritual restoration that does not necessarily affect their outward lives in a physical way not that physical restoration was not needed or seen, it is simply not the focus. For this reason, we see things such as "new wine skins" and "the old self vs. new self," etc. All of this is all applicable to our lives. Do not let it affect how you see the Bible just because we see different things inside its covers. There are two different, yet related, portions of the Bible that are to be read and understood in very different, yet related ways. We all could use spiritual renewal in some point in our lives and I pray that through these few short devotionals you understand a bit better how it happens and how you can obtain it through the Power of the Lord.
