This book extends the discussion of world food problems by giving explicit recognition to the potential role of markets. The authors highlight the contribution of prices to the solution of

food problems in low-income countries, for example, by providing adequate incentives to farmers to expand production, assuring that food supplies can be obtained through trade when needed and giving appropriate signals to consumers. They also document the negative effects on food supply and national welfare of the actual price policies of many Third World governments. While recognizing the problems involved in defining and measuring hunger, as well as in improving the food supply, the authors consider the outlook for future food availability as favorable in terms of continued modest improvement in per capita food supplies at prices, adjusted for inflation, that are likely to continue the slow decline of recent decades. "An accessible, comprehensive analysis of the causes of and potential solutions to the problems of producing and distributing food"-- Debates during the postwar years about how food power could help the United States achieve goals such as stability, prosperity, and security were part of a larger conversation about the role of food in the security of states, communities, and individuals. America helped build a new, postwar food system based on the steady influence of American agricultural surpluses that helped maintain stable prices and food availability. This system averted a global-scale food crisis for almost three decades. The end of this food system in the early 1970s ushered in a much more unstable period in global food relations. 'Food power' argues that efforts to both interpret America's role in the world during the mid-twentieth century and to address contemporary food problems can be strengthened by understanding more fully the ways postwar American policymakers and experts sought to shape the politics of security and prosperity by linking people and places around the world through food. Is it possible to feed those who now are hungry in the world in addition to the billions of people who will be born by the end of the century? Or are we headed for an inevitable Malthusian catastrophe because the task is impossible? What can developing countries do to increase agricultural self-reliance? What population dynamics accompany the transition from high birth and death rates in developing countries to low birth and death rates? What research can aid

the struggle to provide food to the world's masses? These and other questions are explored by an array of experts who participated in the Congressional Roundtable on World Food and Population during 1979-80. They offer this collection of papers in the spirit of optimism about the future and about the U.S. role in international development. Food and Agriculture in Global Perspective: Discussions in the Committee of the Whole of the United Nations presents the problem of food and agriculture in its total global international perspective from the point of view of the specialized agencies of the United Nations system and the States Members of the United Nations. The book discusses the problem of food and agriculture and its handling in the global perspective; groups the statements of the problem around international agency views and around the views of Member States; and presents the progress report of efforts by international agencies and by States. The text also describes the excerpts from the technical documents, and statements of Agency representatives and Member States in the seven specific issue areas found in the Agreed Conclusions of the Committee. The World Food Council was created as the coordinator and implementor of resolutions passed at the 1974 World Food Conference in Rome. The Council is responsible for publicizing the needs, encouraging actions, seeking support, and coordinating the participation of nations and international organizations regarding world food problems. The billion-dollar International Fund for Agricultural Development began operations in 1977 with commitments of \$436 million from oil-exporting countries, \$200 million from the United States, and \$367 million from other developed countries. Although a great deal has been accomplished to alleviate world hunger and malnutrition since the 1974 Conference, increases in food production have not reached the modest goals which were set.

Attitudes of complacency and lack of political will are evident; calls to reduce military expenditures have not been successful; continued population growth has worsened the balance between food supplies and population growth; and efforts to include women in food and development projects have been minimal. Moreover, a unique situation exists wherein available funds tend to exceed suitable projects. Food production assistance increased 3.1 percent in 1976, with only a 1.2 percent increase in the most needy countries. Malnutrition is even more prevalent in the world today due to a lack of understanding of nutrition, the low priority it receives, and lack of an overall assessment of nutritional problems. A long overdue international wheat agreement and a food aid convention are needed. Little has been accomplished in the area of food trade due to export restrictions in developing countries, and fear of political and economic repercussions. Although funds for agrarian reform and rural development have increased impressively since 1973, progress has been slow because identification and preparation of suitable projects has not kept pace with the available funds. The issues of hunger and malnutrition no longer have the visibility or priority they had at the time of the 1974 Conference, despite the fact that the problem is just as serious now as it was then. Why do millions of people in the less-developed countries go hungry - while there is an abundance of food in the world? What can be done about it? These are the issues explored in this accessible and comprehensive text. In addition to incorporating updated data throughout, this new edition includes: a comprehensive description and analysis of the 2008 food crisis; an expanded discussion of the impact of using food crops to produce biofuels; new case studies and recent examples to illustrate key points; examples of successful and unsuccessful policy approaches; and

reference to the latest research findings (with more than 150 new citations). The result is the best available analysis of the current world food problem, as well as a provocative assessment of prospects for the future. The aim of this publication is to provide the interested reader with an authoritative and comprehensive up-to-date bibliography on all important facets of the world food problem, encompassing such questions as the availability of natural resources, the present and future sources of energy, environmental quality, population growth, world malnutrition, the state of food production, food consumption patterns, future food needs, toxicological aspects of food, agricultural and industrial aspects of food production, and family planning. It is the first compilation of its kind in that it covers the subject from a multidisciplinary point of view, including publications that deal with the description and analysis of the world food problem as well as those that offer alternative strategies and specific technological measures for alleviating the problem.
